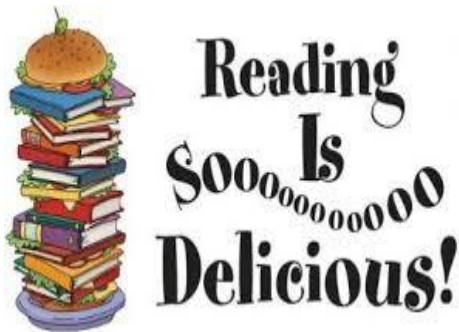
**Cooking Club**
